Strong storms can cause power outages. Be prepared before lights go out and keep your phone fully charged. Here's how to get ready:

Emergency Kit

- **Water** (1 gallon per person, per day)
- **Non-perishable food and can opener**
- **Flashlights and extra batteries**
- **First aid kit**
- **Cash** (ATMs may not be working; small bills are best)
- **Warm clothing, shoes, gloves, and blankets**
- **Sanitation supplies** (moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties)
- **Whistle** to signal for help
- **Family needs** (infant supplies, pet supplies; prescriptions and medications, eyeglasses; emergency phone numbers, important documents)

Safety Recommendations

- Do not use grills, barbecues, or portable generators inside, because these create carbon monoxide which can cause death
- Stay away from downed power lines.
- Keep refrigerators and freezers closed to preserve food.
- Unplug sensitive electronics to protect them from surges when power returns.
- Check on neighbors.

Stay Connected

- Keep a charged power bank for your phone.

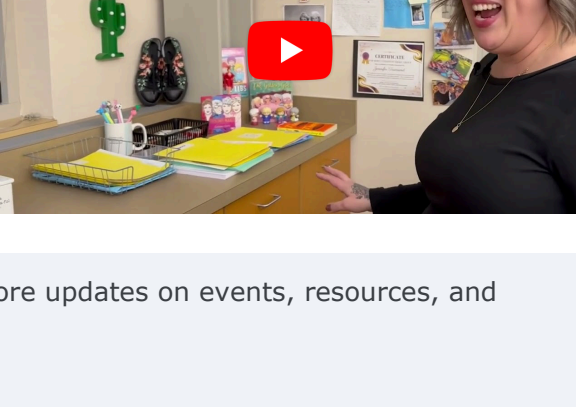
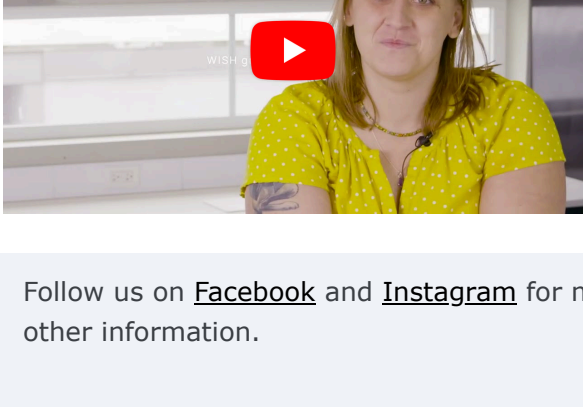
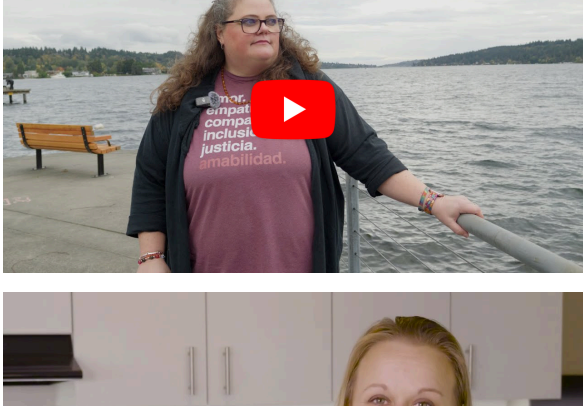
